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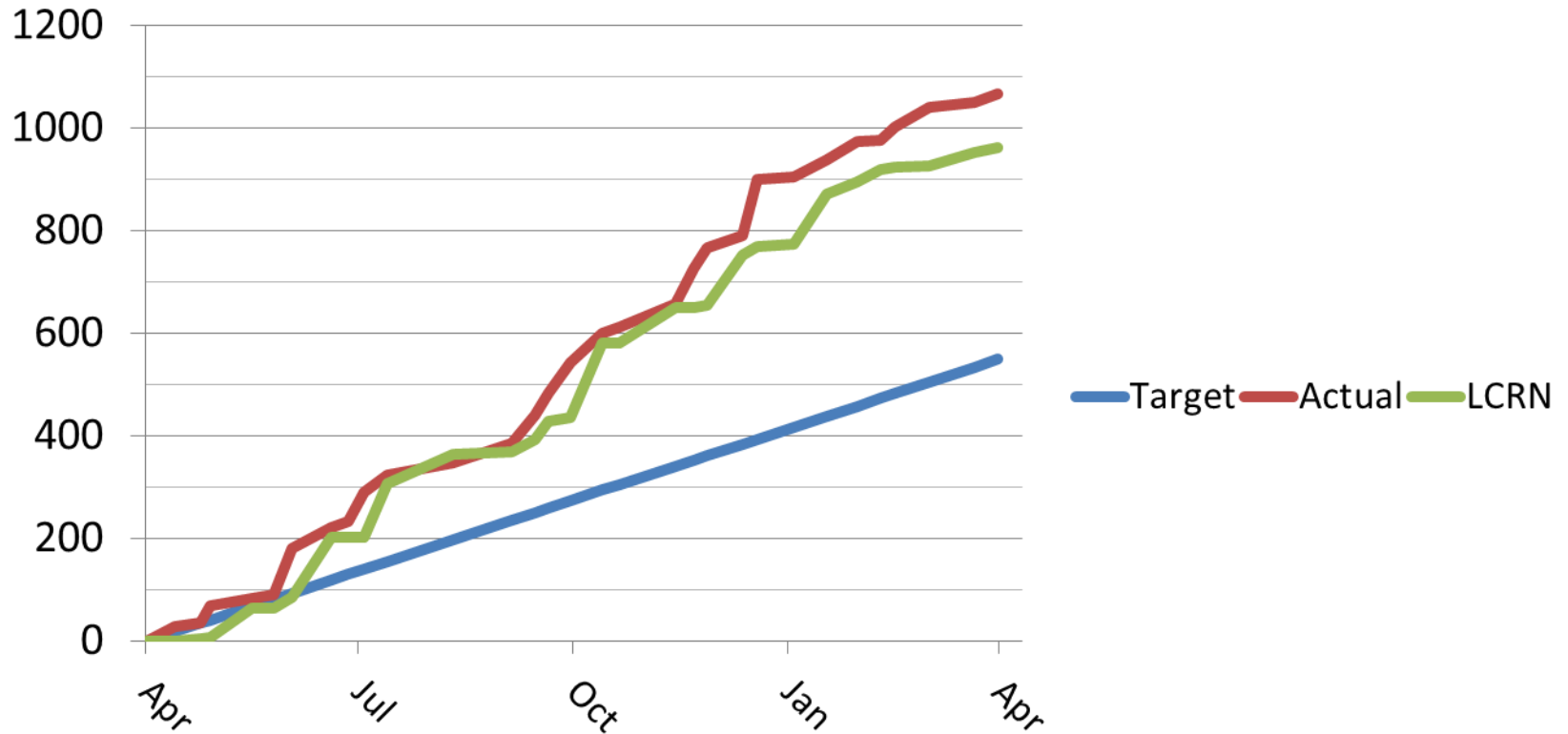
All change!

- New educational roles- Research Forum part of the Postgraduate medical training, extended placements for nursing students

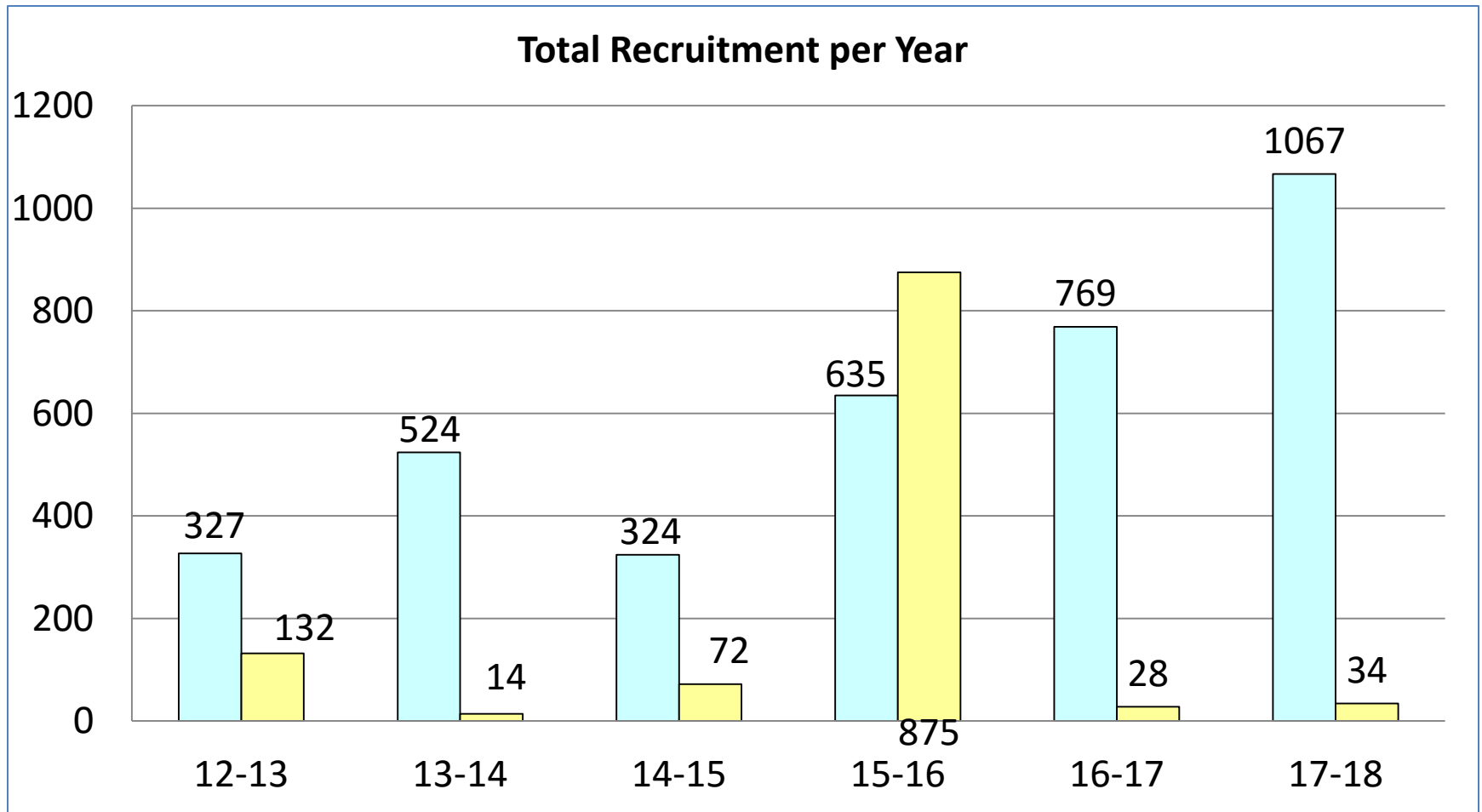
All change!

Why does it matter?

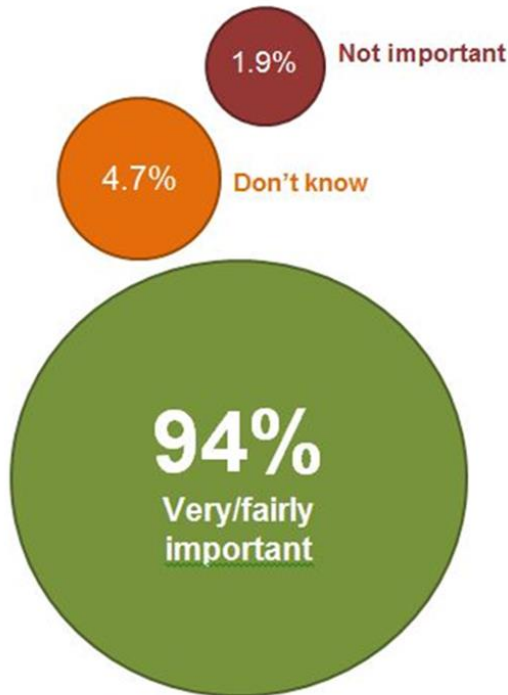
- Review published in 2015: Does research engagement by clinicians and organisations improve healthcare performance?
- 33 papers identified, 28 identified improvements in healthcare performance
- *Current evidence suggests that there is an association between the engagement of individuals and healthcare organisations in research and improvements in healthcare performance.*

Why does it matter?

- Outcomes include lower mortality:
- *Research active Trusts had lower risk-adjusted mortality for acute admissions, which persisted after adjustment for staffing and other structural factors.*

Plans for 2018-19

- More engagement with front line clinicians
