Bradford and Craven

Independent system-wide review of children and young people's mental health system

In November of 2019 a review was commissioned by Bradford Districts and Craven CCG, Bradford Metropolitan District Council and Bradford District Care NHS Foundation Trust from the Centre for Mental Health in to the system wide position for Children and Young People's Mental Health. The slides attached to this paper take the BDCFT trust board through the process of the review and the recommendations of the report. These slides were prepared by Sasha Bhat, Head of Mental Wellbeing for Bradford Districts and Craven CCGs and presented with permission so that the board has the same information as presented to local councillors and to the CCG.

In response to this review and to the concerns leading to the review the mental health of children and young people has been identified as one of the programmes under Act as One. The Act as One Programmes have programme managers and steering groups. The Senior Responsible Owner for the Act as One CYP Wellbeing Programme is David Sims, Medical Director, BDCFT. The clinical champion for the programme is Dr Rachel Voller, Consultant Psychiatrist in Children and Young People's Mental Health. The programme manager is Sasha Bhat, Head of Mental Wellbeing, Bradford Districts and Craven CCGs. The Act as One programmes report monthly, with the CYP wellbeing programme reporting to the Bradford Health Care Partnership Board. Each quarter all programmes report to a combine Health Care Partnership Board.

At present the CYP wellbeing programme has developed a programme charter which is attached. There is work that is already in process that has been received by the programme. Dr Rachel Voller is leading work on developing Crisis support. During the period of COVID this has focused on helping to reduce the presentation of young people in emotional and psychological crisis to Accident and Emergency departments. There is work on developing One trusted Referral pathway across BDCFT and VCS providers. The CYP wellbeing programme is supported by 6 young apprentices who have supported the development of the vision and aims of the programme.

There is a BDCFT Strategic Programme for Children's Pathway which picks up this work. The purpose will be to transform service across an integrated pathway of mental health and community care groups.
