

How We Use Your Information

What information do we record?

When you use any of our services, we will record information about you. Bradord District Care Foundation Trust may store large amounts of personal data about you. This will vary greatly depending on which service you are using and can range from simply your name and contact details to detailed assessments of your health and medical care plans. You will find more details about what information we record on the notice for the service area you are using but a general overview of what information we may record is shown below.

Personally Identifiable Information

- Name
- Date of Birth
- Address

- Information about people who care for you or know you well

Sensitive Personal Information

- Your Medical Diagnosis
- Ethnicity
- Religion

- Care plans
- Reports about you

- To help doctors, nurses and other healthcare professionals to make the right decisions about your care
- To provide us with the right information to refer you to the service that can support you best
- To allow us to assess and review the care you receive
