


First Aid Skin Tear Pathway

1. If the resident/ patient develops a skin tear, follow the clinical pathway below and apply appropriate first aid treatment. For further support, contact Telemedicine.
2. Telemedicine will support you through the pathway below and signpost your resident for on-going care and support.
3. For further training and support please contact your Tissue Viability Team.






Mepilex® Border Comfort



Dressing removal should occur from the base of the arrow and peel in the direction of the remaining skin flap.


Application Guide



1. Gently cleanse the wound according to local protocol.

2. Approximate wound edges, classify the wound, measure and document.

3. **Mepilex® Border Lite** to be applied to Type 1 and Type 2 skin tears.
Mepilex® Border Comfort to be applied to Type 3 skin tears.



Time to change: Up to 7 day wear time. However, a dressing change should be considered once the exudate spreads past the zone highlighted in red.

If you observe changes in the wound or surrounding skin such as increased redness, swelling, odour, pain or heat, please assess the wound and refer to local protocol.

If no refer to Unplanned Community Nurse Team

If yes give appropriate advice around monitoring and refer for a planned Community nurse visit with a date.
